# SSH in the first call of Horizon 2020

- **199 out of 540 topics** in the first call of Horizon 2020 (Pillar 2 and 3 + RI, Widening and SWFS) are flagged as SSH-relevant
- Within the flagged topics the involvement of SSH will differ from a dominating/defining role to a more limited role
- The **SSH flagged topics** constitute **37 %** of all topics and an estimated budget available for SSH of **448 million euros**. This represents 5.3 % of the budget (3,8 % excluding SC6)
- The **Excellent Science** pillar is a very important instrument to support SSH research - the indicated share of SSH of the budgets for the ERC and Marie Skłodowska-Curie represents approximately **700 million euros** for SSH for the first call of Horizon 2020

# Description of the "Topics" of the Work Programme

- *Specific Challenge: Sets the context, the problem to be addressed, why intervention is necessary*
- *Scope: delineates the problem, specifies the focus and the boundaries of the potential action BUT without describing specific approaches*
- *Expected Impact: describe the key elements of what is expected to be achieved in relation to the specific challenge*



## Calls for proposals – indicative timetable

- **Publication of WP 2014-15: 11 December 2013**
- **Deadlines 2014** vary across topics: **April-September 2014**
- **Deadlines 2015** vary across topics: **May 2015**
- **Timeline:** ESRs - 5 months after deadline, GAs – 3 months after ESRs
- Separate timelines for Other actions

National Contact Points (NCPs) are set up to guide researchers in their quest for securing EU funding.
